UPDATE ON FEDERAL ACTIVITIES

<u>House of Representatives Passed H.R. 748, Heads to President</u>— March 27, 2020. The \$2 trillion Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) stimulus package passed the House on

Friday. It nows goes to the President where he is expected to immediately sign it. Warning — it is 880 pages long. <u>Families First Coronavirus Response Act: Q&A Updated by US DOL</u> — March 27, 2020. The United States Department of Labor updated its FAQ overnight. It now addresses questions for employers under multi-employer collective bargaining agreements and other employee leave questions.

UPDATE ON CALIFORNIA ACTIVITIES

Governor Newsom Statement on H.R. 748 — March 27, 2020. The governor indicated that the federal legislation will provide critical support for California's COVID-19 fight. He stated the state and local governments will need additional assistance in the future.

SCCA AND SCCA MEMBER, OTHER RESOURCES

<u>LA County Issues Limited Stop Work Order for Projects Requiring Utility Interruptions</u> — March 26, 2020. Los Angeles County issued a limited stop work order for projects that require a utility interruption. This order is intended to minimize the impact of residents at their homes. Active construction projects that could create hazards if work is not completed are explicitly exempt. The order <u>only applies</u> to unincorporated areas of LA County for county road and flood control district rights of way.
